### Reading:

Students will login to HMH (please see login page for more details) and go to assignments. First, students should complete the read and respond journal "Let's Play Ball". Then, watch the Get Curious video and look at the Central Idea Anchor Chart. Next, click on 'My Book: Prepare to Read' looking at the Genre study, and critical vocabulary and continue to read & /or listen to the non-fiction text, How Did That Get In My Lunchbox? Please do not read the next story if one is available. After reading &/or listening to How Did That Get In My Lunchbox? view the Close-Read Screencast and please take the online story assessment. ### 1. Study Island

Go to lpisd.org

Click students on the top right-hand corner

Click Clever

Login: username: lastname.firstname

Scroll down until you see the Study Island link-click it

On the Study Island home screen, it has a box titled Active Assignments. All assignments for the week are listed there.

Side Note: If your student has already completed a lesson under any of the sections and passed with an 80% or better they will complete the next assignment. If they do not pass, they must redo the assignment.

### 2. Clever- Social Studies Weekly

Students will follow the same login instructions as Study Island. Once logged in, Click the red link labeled Studies Weekly.

Click the Newsletter labeled Texas Communities

Click on the assigned week from the lesson plan.

Click continue reading.

Students will read through the articles. This system has an audio version so they may listen as well. When students finish reading, students should finish the test that follows. The test link is located on the far-left side.

### 3. Student email

During this time of the school year, I teach students how to access their student email accounts. In this account they are able send me emails, create word documents, and practice using power point. Students can share their documents with me. It also saves all their work.

Once logged in, they will have to choose a time zone (Central) and then they have access to their accounts. They may email me for anything! On the top left corner, you will see nine dots in the shape of a square next to the word Outlook. If you click that, it will give you options to use other programs like Word or PowerPoint. We will be using both during this time.
